Hello Melissa,

Thank you for speaking with me today. You may know the 14th State District Court (Ind, IZard & Fulton Counties) Administrative Plan for 2026-2027 is due July 1, 2025 and I am in the process of getting it finalized & then submitted to the Administrative Office of the Courts. However, per A.C.A. §16-17-1116, Mammoth Spring is a designated department of Fulton County Dist Court, so I need an ordinance from the Mammoth City Council waiving the holding of court there once per month. The requirement comes from the following statute:

Pursuant to A.C.A. §16-17-138, sessions of court must be held at least one (1) time per month in each department unless mutually waived by the district court judge and the governing body of the city or town where the department is located.

Chief Turnbough informed me earlier that hearing Mammoth cases in Salem would be fine, but apparently a written agreement/ordinance to that effect is needed for the Administrative Plan. So, if you or the Mammoth City Attorney could get that to me asap, I would appreciate it. In the interim, I will go ahead & submit the Plan stating that such an agreement/ordinance is in the works, and amend it later to include the ordinance.

If you or the Mammoth City Attorney wish to discuss this further or need help with the wording of the ordinance, please contact me and I'm certainly happy to do so.

ORDINANCE NO. 2015-01

CITY OF MAMMOTH SPRING, FULTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS

**AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING THE DISTRICT COURT
CLERK AS THE OFFICIAL RESPONSIBLE FOR THE
COLLECTION OF FINES ASSESSED IN DISTRICT COURT
FOR THE CITY OF MAMMOTH SPRING, ARKANSAS.**

WHEREAS, Ark. Code Ann. 16-13-709 provides that the city must designate the official primarily responsible for the collection of fines assessed in district court for the City of Mammoth Spring, Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it is appropriate to designate the District Court Clerk of the City of Mammoth Spring as the official responsible for the collection of fines assessed in District Court for the City of Mammoth Spring Arkansas.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED, BY THE City Council of the City of Mammoth Spring, as follows:


Section 1. The Fulton County District Court Clerk is hereby designated as the person primarily responsible for the collection of fines assessed in District Court for the City of Mammoth Spring, Arkansas.

Section 2. All ordinances previously enacted in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.


Section 3. An emergency is declared therefore this Ordinance becomes effective upon its passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 1998-04

**AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 1997-03;
AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE POSTING OF
ORDINANCES OF A GENERAL AND PERMANENT NATURE;
AND OTHER PURPOSES.**

WHEREAS, Arkansas Code Annotated, §14-55-206, requires the publishing or posting of all ordinances of a general or permanent nature and all those imposing any fine, penalty, or forfeiture passed and approved by the City Council of the City of Mammoth Spring, Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, Arkansas Code Annotated, § 14-55-206, further provides that in municipalities in which no newspaper is published then the requirements of publishing of the ordinance may be met by posting said ordinance in the five (5) most public places as designated by the governing body in an ordinance; and

WHEREAS, there is currently no newspaper being published within the City of Mammoth Spring, Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 1997-03 provided for the five (5) most public places as designated by the governing body and one of those places has now burned.


NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Mammoth Spring, Arkansas:

Section 1: That the City Council of the City of Mammoth Spring, Arkansas, does, per Arkansas Code Annotated § 14-55-206, designate the following five (5) places within the City of Mammoth Spring, Arkansas, as public places where any and all ordinances passed by the City Council shall be posted:

1. ~~Union Planters Bank~~ *New Sunnyside Bank*
2. Mammoth Spring City Hall/Library
3. The Palace Drug Store
4. The Meyers Pharmacy
5. Mammoth Spring Police Department
